

Richard P. O'Beirne Memorial Foundation Scholarship

Richard P. O'Beirne was a 1958 graduate of NFA and a long-time resident of the Hudson Valley area. He dedicated his professional life to improving the lives of the citizens of the Hudson Valley. He focused on thinking big and implementing his ideas with large and small actions that would lead to great rewards. His vision was for an even greater Hudson Valley; one with abundant job opportunities; an educated, talented work force; and unsurpassed family and community spirit.

The Richard P. O'Beirne Memorial Foundation, created to celebrate, honor, and continue Mr. O'Beirne's work, is pleased to offer two scholarship opportunities to Newburgh Free Academy seniors who have made a positive contribution to the Hudson Valley (through school or community involvement, athletics, volunteerism, church activities, family life, etc.). There are TWO scholarships available, each in the amount of the \$1,000. One scholarship will be awarded to a student accepted to attend a two-year college or trade school in New York State; one scholarship will be awarded to a student accepted to a four-year college/university in New York State.

To qualify, the student must meet the following criteria:

- 1. Student must complete the application form and answer the essay questions.
- 2. Student must have completed two full years at Newburgh Free Academy.
- 3. Student must be a graduating senior.
- 4. Student must have been **accepted** to a New York State two-year or four-year college/university/trade school or other accredited post-secondary program.

In addition to the criteria listed above, positive consideration will be given to those applicants who have demonstrated citizenship, service, and/or leadership to the school/community. These qualities/accomplishments will enhance an applicant's standing in the evaluation process, and should be included in the application.
